Some time ago Job reported to us that there had been a storm that went through San Luis Rio Colorado and did considerable damage to their church. Well, plans are coming together to replace the church roof with a whole new 2nd story with a small

It has changed the way that we do ministry. We used to go over there, stay in their homes, work together, pray and worship together. It was fun to be able to "communicate" through smiles and "sign language."

Now all we can do is listen to their needs, their problems, help evaluate the possible solutions they can come up with, and then rejoice when we hear of the people at Mesias conducting an Internet radio show each week, Pastor Isaac's children attending the university for engineering and nursing, Naftali thanking us for our old church van that he uses every Saturday to cover the town of Rio Bravo picking up eighteen youth for their youth group at Betania, and then hearing how Samuel Perez Herrera and Job Jimenez Tejeda are stepping in the leadership roles in Matamoros and San Luis Rio Colorado. At Betania in Rio Bravo and Santisima Trinidad in Matamoros eight to twelve people get together every week at the church to participate as students in special interactive Internet classes that are being taught at the Lutheran Hispanic Missionary Institute in El Paso.

The Lord is still working. He is just doing it in another way. I guess that means that we don't give up and get discouraged because <u>we</u> can't go down there and have fun or be inspired by their enthusiasm. They still have it. We just have to work a little harder at catching it "long distance."

Did you realize that the last time we went down to El Calvario Lutheran Church in Brownsville we bit off more than we could handle? There was more work to be done than we could possibly get done in two days. Some of you remember how we used to go and work in Mexico, building churches, houses, fixing up Carmelita's home. Well, some good lessons were learned. On Saturday, thirteen people from Rio Bravo and Matamoros showed up with smiles on their faces, warm hearts, wanting to be part of the greater Body of Christ helping their Christian brothers and sisters. I don't even know if they asked what there was to do. It seemed to me that they just looked around, gave everyone a hug and went to work.

The Lord hasn't forgotten His people!



The ministry goes on. Pulpits need to filled, families fed, pastors trained. At the moment we send subsidy to Mexico in the amount of \$3650 a month. That doesn't count the needs of Josafat in San Luis Rio Colorado. He drives a taxi during the day and tries to be husband, preacher, and student at night. That \$3650 doesn't count anything being done for two of the missions in the desert near San Luis Rio Colorado. At the moment there is no one to serve them because of a lack of transportation.

Yes, the ministry goes on but not without our help, not without your help. The people there are eager to help but they need to strengthen their understanding of the Scriptures. They need educational material, Vacation Bible School material, they need to take theology classes. We can't go down there but we can help pay for the Bible classes that the members are taking. We can help pay for the theology classes the men are taking. We can supply VBS material. And that does not include any transportation, hospital bills, funeral expenses, repairing church buildings etc. Yes, those are some of the "other" things that we help with.
