President Abiut felt that such a retreat would be a blessing to their pastors and also to others who might attend. President Abiut also felt that it is important for pastors and leaders of congregations that have helped them out through KIMA, CAN-DO, and the District to meet with them face to face and grow together. Both Mexican and U.S. pastors will lead Bible studies, essays, and prayers. KIMA agreed to help out financially the pastors of the Lutheran Synod of Mexico to gather at this retreat. Mexicali or San Luis Rio Colorado are both located right along the border near Southern California and Arizona. It is possible to drive there. #### NATIONAL ASSEMBLY

On November 14-16 the Lutheran Synod of Mexico had their National Assembly. All the pastors, except for Rev. Juan Rosas who is on dialysis and a representative of each congregation were present for the meetings. We are happy to say that Rev. Jaziel who has been fighting lung cancer was able to attend. KIMA, because of generous donations from people like you, was able to help out financially in providing for the transportation and needs of the pastors that attended. Some of these people had to travel by bus for over 16 hours to get there. Due to the fact that the government owns the churches and the Lutheran Synod of Mexico civil association owns most of the parsonages much discussion was centered on reports, taxes etc.

There are going to be some reforms in the Constitution of the Lutheran Synod of Mexico. On December 4-5 five pastors will get together in Mexico City to talk about the reforms. The five pastors are the three pastors from Mexico City, Rev. Samuel Perez of San Pedro, Rev. Jaziel Lopez of San Pablo, Rev. Alvaro Lopez of El Buen Pastor, and Rev. Abiut Fajardo, president of the Synod and pastor of Todos Santos in Guadalajara, and Pastor Isaac Garcia, treasurer of the Synod and pastor of Betania and Mesias in Rio Bravo and Santisima Trinidad in Matamoros.

#### **BIBLICAL INSTITUTE**

They still have a desire, and obviously a need, to prepare men to be future pastors. It seems that there will be some initial training, classes in Introduction to the Old & New Testament, homiletics, hermeneutics, evangelism, Lutheran doctrine, confessions, and history of the Reformation. Having successfully completed these studies the men would be assigned to a congregation where they would serve as lay-pastors. They would then, over the course of time, receive additional classes that would help to give them additional skills to serve as pastors. He accepts this challenge with humbleness, a little bit of fear, excitement, and great anticipation of what the Lord will do through the leadership of the Lutheran Synod of Mexico.
