One of the goals of KIMA is to assist congregations to become "partner or sister congregations" with one of the congregations of the Lutheran Synod of Mexico. A good example of this is Faith Lutheran Church in Hot Springs Village, Arkansas. If you ever go on a visit to Hot Springs Village make sure you include a visit to this congregation while you are there.



For a while they sent money to KIMA for San Mateo in San Luis Rio Colorado. Later, a few members went down to San Luis to help on a project or two. Now Faith Lutheran has included the ministry of Pastor Jimenez and San Mateo in their budget. Each month they send them \$200 plus any special gifts that come in. They send their gifts and communicate directly with Pastor Jimenez and the congregations. A group of about ten people just returned from a trip to San Luis. I am pleased to share with you a letter that two of them sent to me.

Pastor Finke.

We arrived home Wednesday evening from our trip to San Luis, Mexico. What a rewarding experience seeing the Lord work through this group of people. As we knew before we left Hot Springs, we would not have help from KIMA or Can-Do. We arrived New Year's Day in Yuma, AZ.

Friday Jan.2, Bruce, Jim Cunningham and Larry Smith went to search out the cost of supplies in Yuma at Lowe's and Home Depot. Sat. Jan 3. We went to Mexico to see what was needed to be done. We took a member of Christ Lutheran in Yuma. He spoke both English and Spanish very well. He was so helpful and said he was willing to help any time. He grew up in San Luis, Mexico so was very familiar with the city. However, he had not been back for many years as his grandparents and aunts and uncles had all passed away.

We met with Pastor Jiménez and Deacon Jesus Jiménez (no relation) who is helping Pastor at the Mesa Rica church. He is fluent in both Spanish and English. Pastor Jiménez is also giving instructions to 2 lay people on Saturday. They would like to someday become ministers, but that is a long way off.

Monday January 5th we went to work. By this time we had 2 more couples, the Gallers and the Breeches with us.

We were able to get a great amount of the material in San Luis, MX. We were also surprised to see 14 students from Wisconsin there. They were staying in the church. They said someone met them and got vans for them to come to San Luis, MX. They had a small amount of money for materials but didn't know what they should do. They helped Martha's husband with a roof on their house on Monday and some of the students then came to help us on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday. We had their help at the church. We bought the materials and they helped with the work. God's hand was surely in this. The church needed a new roof and they were very willing to put the roof on with a little guidance from Larry.

Bruce, Don, Wayne Jim and Larry did the measuring and put up a drop ceiling, complete with 4 fluorescent lights.

The ladies did the painting inside. The youth cleaned and painted the wrought iron on the windows outside. The youth also laid tiles in the Sunday School room. They laid block for a walk way from the church to the kitchen.

The youth left San Luis on Friday, but we were grateful for their help. They were a great witness to all they came in contact.

We finished at the church in the first week. We did contract to have concrete work done and stucco for the interior of the Sunday School and kitchen. It really looked good.

We went to Mexico to church on Sunday. The surprised look on the members' faces. Pastor had a very emotional service of Thanksgiving. What a joy to see the young children and have them sing for us. We also built three bookcases for them.

We started the next week at Carmen's house. What a challenge. Our daughter came from Springfield, IL to help for a week. Being an engineer and having built a number of projects (and young) she was a great asset. By this time, Gallers were on their way home and Smith's were leaving to go to TX for the birth of a grandchild, Breeches had spent their two weeks; our crew was cut to just Neunabers and Cunninghams. We finished the job. Larry and Jim put in a new toilet and flooring for her.

Tar was put on the bedroom roof as it leaked. We built a 10 x 24 kitchen, complete with sink, counter top and we bought cabinets, vinyl floor, and 2 windows. We painted the exterior of the house including the room that Mike Shaw built for her a few years ago. We bought paint for her bedroom and she was going to paint it. She was so grateful. We got some help from Job, Fili (Pastor's sons) and Raphael (Martha's husband) Job and Elizabeth are still in school.

We also went to Fronterizo to see the new church site that LWML (Arizona District) bought for them. We did not see the church interior. The plot was probably about an acre.

We did ask about the government owning the churches. If they are not in a Pastor's name or owned by an individual the government can use the facility or sell it to someone else if not being used. The Fronterizo property is in Pastor Jiménez name and the San Mateo church also.

Pastor Jiménez home was vacated by someone so he was able to get possession of it some years ago. He is working on getting it in his and Martha's name. If the church is in someone's name, upon their death it can go to the next pastor or party but the government doesn't posses it.

This is our understanding of how the system works. Everything is in Pastor's name, so all checks are sent to Pastor Jiménez for his distribution. The church does not have an account. He certainly doesn't keep much for himself. He feeds many people, spiritually as well as physically.

This is a long letter but wanted to let you know how we did in San Luis.

We also took almost a hundred bags of clothing, health kits and blankets.
