Over and above the designated money that we have on hand they estimate that we will need an additional \$6432 to finish the project.



They feel that local people are over charging. That's one of the reasons the five of them went over to Guasave. They would like some groups to come down and help them finish this church. The best time of the year to work is from now through the spring of the year. Those who have been there in the summer know that it gets pretty hot. A member of our Board of Directors, Mr. Ralph Genz, along with the Concordia Academy in Cedar Park, TX, has made it possible for us to receive five computers that can be used in the ministries involving Hispanic ministry. Last week we delivered two computers, a wireless Router and wireless PCI cards to Rev. Steve Morfitt, director of the HISPANIC MISSIONS TRAINING CENTER of S. Texas. It is hoped that these computers will help set up a program in south Texas whereby young Hispanic men studying for the ministry can receive training through a website on the Internet.

We also delivered one computer that will make it possible for Rev. Samuel Perez of Monterrey to communicate both visually and verbally with the other pastors and possible students in Mexico.





We still need a vehicle for Rev. Samuel Perez. He said he needs a vehicle because they live in the parsonage and it is a long way from the Church. They have

worship services three times a week. They have to use a taxi to get around. You have to realize that there are only about twenty active members at El Sembrador in Monterrey and they can pay their pastor only \$200 a month. KIMA provides the rest.

Lack of a car and the distance involved make it difficult for them to carry out their evangelism thrust. In July they conducted Vacation Bible School to use it as an evangelism tool to reach out into the community. They had 60 children and adolescents that attended and their parents attended the closing service. They have all their names and addresses and are attempting to visit them and share the Gospel with them. They ask for your prayers.

We need something like a minivan, something that can transport seven people, preferably an American brand so parts can be easily found, and it has to be a model from the years 1992 - 1997. In talking with Pastor Isaac he felt we could find a vehicle in better shape in the U.S. than they could in Mexico.

We have around \$5000 set aside for this but we have been unable to locate a vehicle that meets the above needs. We had hoped not to pay \$5000 because it will take about a thousand dollars to get the vehicle registered and licensed in Mexico.
