Job Jimenez, the son of the late Rev. Filiberto Jimenez has now finished his preparatory schooling. He wants to prepare to be a pastor. He will attend a university right there in San Luis Rio Colorado. He wants to major in psychology. We could use some help in this area since we are trying to take care of his schooling. His schooling will go on for three years and the cost of it will be approximately \$250 a month.

He will be studying theology through Rev. John Durkovic of the Pacific Southwest District. I believe Pastor Jesus Jimenez will be acting as instructor.
