

God's Blessings from Fort Wayne, Indiana.

The winter quarter is over. It still snowing here in Fort Wayne, our last week of school we had two snow days, that gave us more time to study. I have taken classes like Homiletics II, Hebrew, Liturgics II, Greek readings, Church History II.

A quarter usually last 10 weeks, so The Spring quarter will be 10 weeks, the classes for this quarter are: Hebrew II, Confessing Christ in Today's World, Lutheran Confessions, Theologia II Preaching, Pastoral Theology I. To go out on Vicarage a student needs to have 89 hours, certain courses are prerequisite. So I will be taking classes during summer and fall quarter.

At the end of the fall quarter hopefully I will be going out on Vicarage in a Church somewhere in the United States, Vicarage is for one year. After the Year of Vicarage I will come back to Fort Wayne to finish courses for one more year.

There are many activities going on at New Life Lutheran Church, my Field Work Church. It is a blessing to be able to help Pastor Mike Wakeland at the English Service with Sunday school with the kids; I had the opportunity to preach for couple of times this year already. So we have English service at 10:30 am and then we have Service in Burmese at 1:00 pm, so at 11 am I help with confirmation class for the kids from Burma. I also had the opportunity to preach at the Burmese Service where one of the members

translates my sermon into Burmese. I still do visits at Lutheran Life Villages, which is a retirement home. Usually I visit getting to know the patients talking with them, pray, read the bible, and just spending quality time with them.



During Christmas time, we got together with the youth and some members from the church; we baked cookies and made bags to give out to the people who come to church on Wednesday's service and dinner.

Pastor James holds a bible study for the kids from Burma at his house every Saturday, his son Peter and Gwen teach, so once in a while I get to hang out with them and play. We got to go to the park and slide, it was fun.
