
We are here today because God wants us to help Him on His mission. He is doing all the hard work, preparing the people, but are we ready to join Him on His mission?

2 Peter 3:18 says, 'but grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.'



I hope to God to soon have some confirmations for the glory of God.
