

above and prayed for the little baby girl, Cassandra, that you see sitting on her grandmother Sylvia's lap. Cassandra will be operated on tomorrow morning at the children's hospital in Corpus Christi. With the Lord's help and the doctors' and nurses' skills, they will repair her cleft lip or cleft palate. They asked for your prayers.
