
Leaving US at Donna, TX preparing to enter Mexico


speaks English. He is a fantastic young man and was of unmeasurable help to us both days we were in Mexico.



Wednesday evening, over supper, I got a chance to speak to Luis Moreno, Laypastor of the Mission Mesias (Messiah) in

the colonia near Rio Bravo. They have come a long way from an empty plot of land with no utilities. A wooden

structure was erected by various groups from the States, a cement block building was started out behind the wooden structure for classroom and kitchen. And then nothing more was done, at least structurally. They had worship, VBS, bought a van to pick up people for church, and started a weekly radio program of religious music, sharing of the Word, and taking prayer requests.

Wednesday night we talked. Thursday morning we had breakfast together, talked, prayed, and I believe that the Lord spoke to Luis. He was suddenly excited about doing something. On Sunday morning he talked of glorifying God by erecting a proper house of worship. The people came forward and offered themselves, their talents, and what finances they had and on Monday morning after an 8:00 a.m. prayer service they began. The plan was to scrape the old, use whatever could be salvaged, and restructure the cement block building that was to be a classroom and kitchen into being the new temple. Dismantling the lean-to and buying cement blocks were the first items of business after prayer.
