This morning we put the finishing touches on the Christmas Gifts for the Mission Kids. We have put together120 gifts divided up into three groups 2 to 4-year old's, 5- to 9, and 10 and above. Each group is divided equally between girls and boys. There are hygienic items like toothpaste and toothbrushes, soap and washcloths, writing tablets, pencils, colors, coloring books, soccer ball, dolls, little aprons, arch books, Children's Garden of Bible Stories, Bibles with Luther's Small Catechism, candy, and stuffed animals. Joyce Bretting from Christ the King in Waxahachie, did most of the shopping. Dr. Bobby Haney of 1Twenty2 Ministries, Inc. donated the toothbrushes and toothpaste and we received Bibles and Children's Garden of Bible Stories books from The Lutheran Heritage Foundation. Thrivent is providing funding for last minute purchases and the transportation to deliver these gifts. Mike Shaw will be taking the

gifts down to Pharr, Texas where they will be picked up and distributed by members of Betania Lutheran Church of Rio Bravo. We are hoping that some of these gifts can make their way down to the new mission in Chiapas.

We started the year with \$611 for this project. We have added \$360 to that over the course of the year and currently have a balance of \$81. We hope to be able to send a several hundred dollar donation to the Lutheran Heritage Foundation as they do not charge for their books but rely on donations. We try and purchase items all year long whenever we can find "great" sales like in January, after Easter, and before school starts. Any help in covering that expense and establishing a fund for next year would be appreciated.

We had a project earlier this year to help the new mission in Chiapas. I told you I would keep you informed as to the progress of raising funds for that. Initially we sent \$1,200.
