There were no services but each week various SLM pastors from different parts of Mexico led worship from either their homes or offices. In the last few weeks, they have been given permission to meet once again for worship. Rev. Omar Garza at Santisima Trinidad in Matamoros is now having three services every Sunday. They have one in the morning for

people over 60 years old and women who are pregnant. One in the afternoon for all other members and one in the evening for members and friends that just need the encouragement of God's Word. Pastor Omar is also presently enrolled at Concordia Seminary in St.

Louis for a Master of Arts (M.A.), Spiritual Care Major. The Spiritual Care Major delves into each aspect of theology — exegetical, systematic, historical, and practical — with a unique focus on the spiritual care of women, children, families and people in general.

Earlier this summer Rev. Carlos Catalán, LCMS Missionary from the Chicago area, retired as pastor of Todos Santos in Guadalajara, Jalisco, Mexico. He has since returned to the Chicago area and Todos Santos asked the SLM for help in finding a new pastor. The SLM decided to send the two vicars, Guillermo Leyva and Neftali Garcia, for a short time each to help them out until a decision could be made about calling a new pastor. So, Guillermo Leyva




went to start this process. Within a couple of weeks, Todos Santos was convinced that they had their man and issued a formal Call to him to be their pastor. He accepted the Call and was ordained on September 20, 2020.



We need your prayers for Pastor Luis Moreno, lay-pastor at Misión Luterana El Mesías in Rio Bravo. He is currently enrolled in the FPH program at the Concordia Reformer Lutheran Seminary in Palmar Arriba, Dominican Republic studying to be an ordained pastor. This program is like the LCMS program of SMP. Pastor Luis has lost about 70% of his sight in one eye and is beginning to

lose sight in the other. At first, they thought it might be glaucoma but now have determined that he has a tumor on his brain. We thank the Lord that at the beginning of this year we were able to enroll him and seven others in the Social Security Insurance program of Mexico which includes medical care. He will be







The people at Betania Lutheran Church in Rio Bravo have been conducting a Saturday morning children's Bible School for children of their immediate community. There are lots of children in the area, many of whom have both parents working to make ends meet. The people of Betania have been able to provide the funding necessary for this outreach program but since the pandemic occurred many have lost their jobs and Betania could no longer financially support this program. They had people who could do the work of cooking, teaching, creating games, leading songs, etc. but they did not have the funding for the materials needed. In fact, some of the children were scrounging around in the garbage to find food to eat. Betania

came to KIMA and asked for help until their people get back to work and can support this program by themselves. We are sending \$50 a week to help.



If he is able to find a vehicle

suitable to do the job, it will be off to Mexico City for the ordination of Neftali and soon thereafter down to Cacahoatan, Chiapas to show the new church there how to conduct a Bible School and deliver gifts to the children from KIMA.

The Lord gave us all the Great Commission to go and make disciples! The purpose of KIMA is to enable God's people to join forces and provide finances and materials that will help our Christian brothers and sisters in Mexico to reach out to people in their neighborhoods so that they may learn of the love and forgiveness of God so that they also may spend an eternity with Him in heaven.
