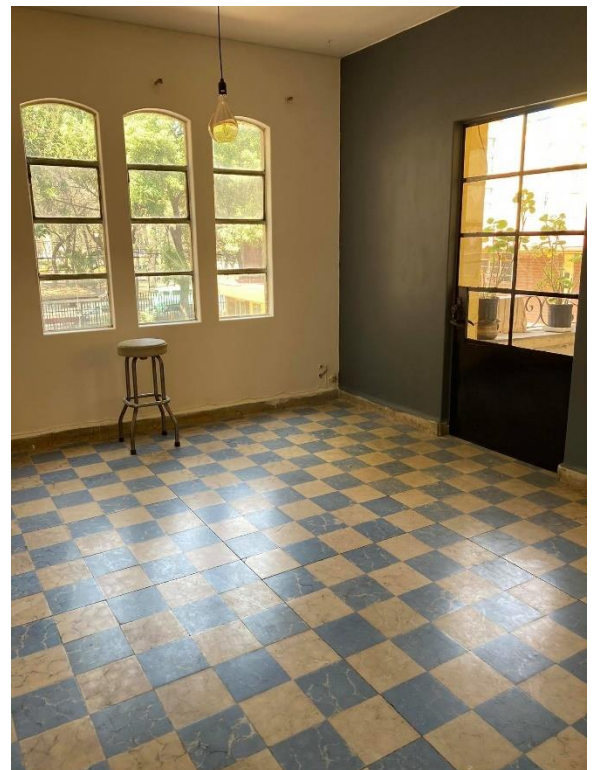
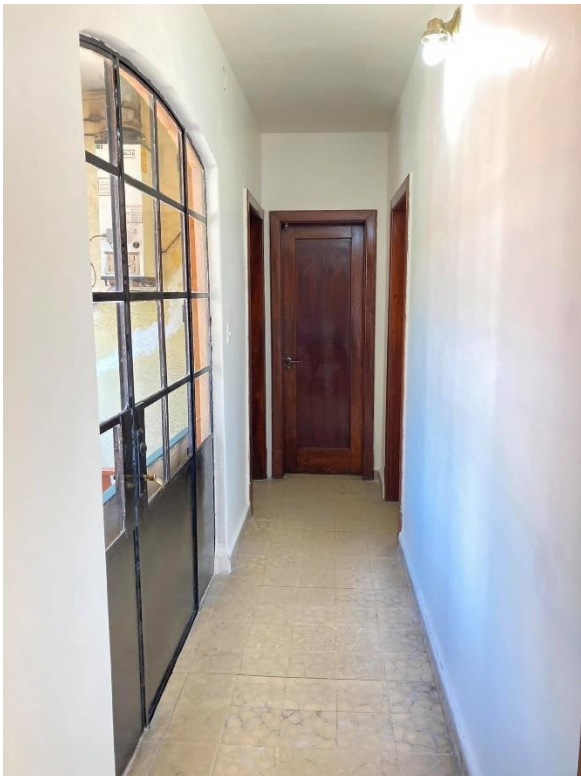


I want to thank many of you who responded with prayers and financial assistance. We have been able to send him about \$980 that he is using to fix up the place so he can settle in and get on with the ministry.
