Pass It On!

When was the last time you played tag? Let's see, I am 76, will be 77 in 12 days. I would guess the last time I played tag was probably something like 65 or 70 years ago. Can't be! But probably true. Running, chasing each other, finally catching someone, and yelling, "You're it!"

There is a new form of tag which I have not guite mastered yet. On Facebook I get a message that I have been tagged by someone. I remember don't running from anyone or even being part of a game but nevertheless I have been tagged. My grandson, Jordan, also taught me that if I don't know something I can just "google" it. So I did and here is what I got, "When you tag someone, you create a link to their profile. The post you tag the person in may also be added to that person's Timeline. For example, you can tag a photo to show who's in the photo or post a status update and say who you're with. If you tag a friend in your status update, anyone who sees that update can click on your friend's name and go to their profile. Your status update may also show up on that friend's Timeline." Oh, now, I get it! Not really.

Somehow, I would guess, these two forms of tag are very remotely related -- I was "it" and now you are "it". The ball was in my court and now it is in your court. I had it and now I pass it on to you; same word, different meaning, but same outcome. Something has been passed on!

Sometimes things are right in front of us and we don't see them, maybe see them but don't want to see them. I think of the words of lesus in Matthew 25:31-46 when He separates the sheep from the goats and puts some at His right hand and some at His left hand. He says to those on His right, "Come, you who are blessed by My Father" and to those who are on His left He says, "Away with you, you cursed ones." Neither group seems to know what they did to deserve this kind of treatment when they say, "Who, me? When did we see you ---?"

In the game of tag or in life, we have been tagged, chosen; we are no longer without excuse, or ignorant; we need to get on with it and do something!

In 2006, I was invited, called by God, to be a part of the Board of Directors of the Lutheran Braille Workers, the largest Christian ministry in the world that provides Braille and specialized Large Print Bibles, free of charge, for the visually impaired. I served on that Board until December 31, 2014.

LBW is an organization that I had heard about because of my mother and father's involvement with it almost since its inception in 1943. I had not paid a whole lot of attention to it since the time I was a kid playing tag out on the playground of Zion Lutheran Church & School in Maywood, California.

So, I had been tagged! I knew I was "it" and the words of St. Paul kept going through my mind, "Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I am fully known." God had a plan for me and He was going to show me what part I was to have in it.

The purpose of both ministries was not to sell a product but to join Jesus in His mission of giving away the free gifts that God is providing through His Word --Love. assurance, forgiveness, adoption, becoming sons daughters and (hijos e hijas), eternal life with God in heaven, joy, peace, overwhelming love, no pain, no sorrow, no frustrations, just joy of Oneness, caring, protection, etc.

One of the recent goals of Lutheran Braille Workers was to make an impact on our Spanish speaking "neighbors." LBW has the equipment, volunteer missionaries in the Work Centers who are making Bibles, devotional materials in Spanish, Braille and specialized large print. Now LBW needs to develop strategies for making contact with the Spanish speaking people who are blind and visually impaired so that we can share the Love and promises of God through His Son Jesus Christ.

I don't think it strange or surprising that God called me, tagged me, to be a part of KIMA & LBW. It was/is His plan. And now I am "chasing you down" and I tag you. For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do. (Ephesians 2:10) What works has He prepared for you to do?

You are now "it," tagged to carry on joining Jesus on His mission. Your talents, interests may be centered, "focusing," on a different area or part of His ministry but don't pretend you haven't been tagged, because you have -- I did it and God has done it from eternity!
